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## **General Recommendations:**

- 1. The time-frame given for the recommendations is too short. It was demanded to extend the duration for a month to have deeper consultations with the community to come up with constructive recommendations with the nuances. The Government of India should facilitate this process.
- 2. The community representatives demanded to formulate a comprehensive National Policy for Transgenders and Intersex Persons as stated in the Supreme Court Judgment

3. The certificate issued should be acceptable to all authorities for indicating the gender on official documents like ration card, passport, birth certificate, aadhaar card, etc.

Introduce separate SEX (with 3 options – MALE, FEMALE and INTERSEX) and GENDER (options - MAN, WOMAN, INTERGENDER, TRANSGENDER and OTHER) columns on all govt/ bank/ school etc. forms to educate the whole society about transgenders, cisgenders and intersex people.

Certification is important but the model given in the Bill is not accepted. Need to look for simpler models. Need more consultation on this. Comparative sheet of laws relating to Transgender in relation to certification process is attached for your reference.

In screening committee number of Transgenders should be equal to or more than Government Representatives, all the major Transgender identities in the District should be represented. E.g. Hijra, pant-shirt Kothi, Female to Male Transgender, Jogappa for Dharwad District screening committee.

In the list of official documents in Chapter II (3) include Election ID card, Driving Licence

Official documents should indicate only the changed name and gender and it should be free of cost. The time-frame should be twenty days

## **Major Gaps and Demands:**

- The Bill needs to speak on right to inheritance of property, housing rights, right to adoption, right to marriage, political and electoral rights. Personal laws amendments
- · Right to housing should be included, housing plots should be provided
- Sensitisation of doctors, nurses, medical professionals, police, Anganwadis, SHGs, child welfare committees, Juvenile Justice boards, orphanages, adoption centres, observation homes, special homes, childcare service providers, all government departments, judiciary, Primary Health Centres
- Safety for Transgenders and InterSex Persons in prisons
- Agricultural land and irrigation facilities, land grants
- A Legal Aid Authority to provide assistance to transgenders facing problems/harassment without prejudice. Effective steps by police department to prevent Transgenders into forced marriages.
- Include Transgenders and Intersex Persons issues in school, college, health, mental health curriculum
- Document, research and promote Transgenders and InterSex cultural forms/practices
- Transgender taskforce to monitor the functioning of all departments in the implementation of the Act
- Appoint Transgender Facilitators to enable Transgenders to access schemes
- Crisis intervention and support, community counselling and 24x7 helplines similar to childline at district level
- Creation of Transgender Commissions at the national and state levels which should be an independent body with judicial powers similar to Election Commission
